



How it works in six simple steps:

1. A traveler contacts Aviation for Humanity wanting to bring supplies to a developing nation they are intending to visit. info@aviationforhumanity.org
2. Aviation for Humanity establishes an in-country contact and locates an underfunded school or orphanage for the traveler to visit. Logistics of timing, transport, number of children in the facility, etc. are coordinated with Aviation for Humanity, the traveler, and the in-country contact.
3. Aviation for Humanity supplies the traveler with the adequate number of backpacks to supply all the children of the facility.
4. Once the traveler arrives in country, they use the Aviation for Humanity Supply Checklist (emailed directly to the traveler) to purchase school supplies and fill the backpacks.
5. The traveler visits the facility, hands out the bags, and sends pictures and a write-up to post on Aviation for Humanity's website.
6. A global community, connected through aviation, is born.



Important Information and Design Intent:

- Purchasing school supplies in-country supports the local economy as well as ensures books are purchased in local languages.
- The cost of purchasing supplies can either be refunded to the traveler once a receipt is provided; or if they choose to donate the money, a tax receipt will be provided for their charitable tax-deductible donation for the cost of the supplies.
- Backpacks are intended for an individual use, as opposed to a shared item. Allowing children to have their own personal supplies not only provides them tools to learn, but empowers them with ownership and allows the children to have direct access and control over their supplies.
